Dear Brothers and Sisters,

The Building Trip to Trujillo Peru was a success. The team left out on July 9th and arrived on the morning of July 10th. The travel was a challenge but the Lord blessed the nine days we had to work.

The Team started work on Monday, July 11. The team of 33 broke into five smaller teams. There was a team welding rebar columns together, one laying out and building the trusses, one building the pews, one mixing mortar for the brick layers and one laying bricks. The bricks the team laid were on the second floor of the building so many had to be handled twice. Everyone pulled together. Praise the Lord!!!!

The project ended work on July 20th and with the Lord's help the team had accomplished great things. The team laid 16,250 bricks, there is no telling how many batches of mortar and concrete were mixed, the team hand poured 44 columns that were 12"x12"x8' tall, the team sanded, glued up and put together 20 pews for the Cascas Mission, the team built 25 trusses which included 60 pieces of 4x8 plywood and over 17,000 screws. Brother Carlos told the team that the work accomplished in nine days would have taken them over two years to accomplish alone. The team wanted to set the trusses but the tie beam still needed to be poured. Brother Carlos said that they would have no problem taking the project from here and putting the roof on before the next school year that starts in January.

Michelle and I arrived home from Peru on the night of July 22nd. The next day we celebrated with Aubree her eighth birthday. It was a blessing to be with friends and family on such a special day.

On Sunday the 24th I had the opportunity to preach at Hillcrest Baptist Church in Rome Georgia. It was great to be at home and even more a blessing to preach without an interpreter. Sunday evening my family and I headed for the great hills of Somerset, Kentucky. We had two weeks to get home and wash clothes before we were back out on another building project.

The two weeks at home were a great blessing. Paul Lamb and I had the privilege of helping Whetstone Baptist Church finish the trim work for their new baptistry. I also preached and shared the Peru trip on Wednesday 27th at White Oak Baptist Church, Sunday 31st at West Somerset Baptist Church and that evening at Whetstone Baptist Church. I appreciate Pastors Reggie Tippen, Larry Butte and Eugene Tarter for allowing me to share about the project.

Please pray for our family. We will be on the road until the middle of October. Please pray for the children as we begin a new school year. We know God is able to give us the wisdom and power we need to meet the tasks ahead. We truly desire your prayers and are so thankful for your support. The two greatest needs for the ministry right now is support for the Macedonian general fund and the reduction of debt for our travel trailer. Thanks for keeping us on your prayer list.
